Structure of the Data File



Structure of the data file (1)

Flat rectangular file in SPSS/ Stata/SAS format - based on simple concatenation of all household files followed by the school files. Files appear in the following order (variable prefixes are shown in brackets)

- Mother/Lone Father Main (MM)
- Mother/Lone Father Sensitive (MS)
- Father/Partner Main (F)
- Father/Partner Sensitive (FS)
- Child Main (CQ)
- Child Core Sensitive (CCS)
- Derived variables scale scores and derived variables such as hhtype, region
- Principal questionnaire (P)
- Teacher-on-self questionnaire (TS)
- Teacher-on-pupil questionnaire (TC)
- Drumcondra scores



Structure of the data file (2)

Most records involve a one to one match

 Some school level data involves a one to many match. E.g., Principal completes one questionnaire (one record) and multiple child records are matched to this



Variable characteristics

- Variable name starts with prefix
- In general, variable name relates to question number on questionnaire (except for derived variables)
- Note not all questions from questionnaire are on the anonymised datafile
- Variable labels are shortened version of question wording from questionnaire
