Ireland's leading centre for quantitative data acquisition, preservation, and dissemination.

Based at UCD Library, its mission is to ensure wide access to quantitative datasets in the social sciences, and to advance the promotion of international comparative studies of the Irish economy and Irish society.



Background

2000

ISSDA was set up in 2000 in the Geary Institute in UCD with support from the CSO & ESRI.

2012

ISSDA transferred from the Geary Institute to UCD Library during the summer of 2012.

2016

A Data Manager for ISSDA was hired, highlighting UCD Library's continuing commitment to ISSDA.

A timeline for change

June
2015

- Launch of Digital Repository of Ireland
- National digital infrastructure, robust policy for sharing and making available of social and cultural data

February
2016

- Establishment of permanent Data Manager role in ISSDA
- Demonstrates UCD Library's continued commitment to developing ISSDA's range of datasets and services

May
2016

- Launch of HRB report *Proposals for an Enabling Data Environment for Health and Related Research in Ireland*
- calls for the implementation of a data access, storage, sharing and linkage (DASSL) model for health data in Ireland

2015 –
2017

- Atlantic Philanthropies fund the CRNINI-PEI Research Initiative
- archive legacy research data from 50+ independent evaluations conducted between 2004 – 2014



- Demonstrates the complexity of the original research




- Drives research impact
